Elizabeth Velez spearheads strategic growth and project diversification for the over 50 year old Velez Organization as President and principal, ensuring that the second-generation construction services firm is one of the longest established and successful in the region. To her credit are hundreds of projects which have come to fruition under her direction, including over 600 units of housing made affordable by State and Federal grants in the Bronx and Harlem, and over thirty billion dollars of significant educational, healthcare and large-scale projects throughout New York.

Today, Ms. Velez is leading the Velez Organization to increasing prominence as the choice builder, construction manager, diversity, equity and inclusion and mentoring partner in New York and beyond. She is a sought-after advocate by numerous public and private institutions on economic development, legislative issues and the building industry.

Ms. Velez was appointed in 2022 by Governor Kathy Hochul to the Board of the Metropolitan Transportation Authority – the largest public transportation network in North America. She is a member of the six-person Traffic Mobility Review Board. She served until 2021 as Commissioner of the NYC Property Tax Reform Commission, which produced public inclusive recommendations to create transparency and equity in the NYC tax system. During her 2020 – 2021 tenure, she provided leadership and direction to the industry during the COVID pandemic, spearheaded the Equity and Inclusion Task Force and Council, and celebrated the Centennial of the organization, including a book, a documentary, several industry symposiums, and the most successful gala in the NYBC history. She continues in a leadership role with the NYBC as the newly created Chair of the NYBC Council of Presidents.

Ms. Velez is a proud cheerleader and supporter for New York, as demonstrated by her many philanthropic, professional, and civic affiliations. She serves as Trustee for the New York City Police Foundation, Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of New York, and Boricua College — one of the few Latino schools of higher education in the area. She is on the Board of Non-Traditional Employment for Women (NEW), supporting workforce development and employment for women in the construction trades. With a focus on youth development, she serves on the Board(s) of Youthbridge, and ACE Mentor-NY. She serves on the Board of Advisors for her Alma Mater — the Hofstra University School of Business.

She is an outspoken advocate and sought after speaker for diversity, leadership, and the building industry. In addition to numerous awards and recognition, Ms. Velez was recognized by City & State as one of the "Manhattan Power 50" for 2022 -2019, "Construction Industry Power 50", "Responsible 100", "Diversity Advocacy 100". Crains NY Business honored her as 2021 "Diversity Advocate of the Year. She was recently honored with the 2022 New York Building Congress Industry Achievement Award, 2022 Hofstra University

Alumni Achievement Award, the 2022 Professional Women in Construction Women of Achievement, and the 2022 Puerto Rican Heritage Award from Comite Noviembre recognizing her work in Puerto Rico.

Thus far in 2023, Ms. Velez is being recognized by City & State with their "Above & Beyond Award", the Manhattan Power 100, as well as the Latino Power 100. The New York Build 2023 Construction Idol recognition, and an honoree at the Salvadori Center Gala. In October of 2023, Ms. Velez was inducted into the National Academy of Construction.
